Karry-All Transport Cart

Introducing the new Karry-All transport cart for storing and transporting the popular Model 80 Karry-Alls. This new cart is the ideal solution for today's fast paced manufacturing environment, allowing operators to quickly and easily load and unload boards, or load and unload complete racks of boards. It is designed specifically for the Model 80 Karry-All, which has become an industry standard because of it's large capacity, solid construction, ESD protection, and ease of adjustment. The Model 80 has 75 slots, offset for easy loading, and each slot measures .110" wide x .155" deep on a .210" pitch. The molded side panels lock securely on the rigid tubular aluminum extrusions with large plastic thumbscrews. Other features of the cart are:

- Holds 6 racks, up to 450 boards in a small amount of floor space.
- Easy to load and unload with the wide slide assembly
- Ideal for JIT. Hold racks with various size boards in one cart
- Hold boards horizontally for secure transport
- Five inch polyurethane swivel and brake casters
- ESD safe with four grounding collet sets and one drag chain.

Did you know that one of Fancort's strengths is our ability to customize many of our products? Because we're metal benders, molders, and very clever people, we can often modify our racks and fixtures to meet very specific customer requirements that most other companies would pass on.

For example, a company once asked us if we had a PCB rack that would work on their carts, ride on a conveyor, be loadable from the front and rear, have carrying handles, and have some way to contain the boards after the rack was loaded. We met their requirements with one of our Model 79 Karry-Alls with the following changes: a flat plate on the bottom for the conveyor, fold down carrying handles, extrusions that extended beyond the card guides to sit on their cart, open in the front and back for loading/unloading, and with two Velcro straps to secure boards after loading.

The company liked the rack so much; they purchased more than 500 of them for two of their facilities.
